Ulf Ekelund

Council Epidemiology Unit, University of Cambridge where he currently holds a part time senior investigator scientist position. His main research interests are related to measurement and population levels of physical activity; the role of physical activity and sedentary behaviour for preventing non-communicable diseases especially obesity and metabolic diseases; and to understand the biological basis for physical activity and sedentary behaviour with a special focus on young people. He has published more than 250 peer-review articles including papers in The Lancet, JAMA, PLOS Medicine and Nature Genetics and his current H-index is 63. Ekelund is on the executive board for the International Society for Physical Activity and Health, Fellow and incoming international treasurer on the Board of Trustees for the American College of Sport Medicine, associate editor of Medicine and Science in Sport and Exercise and the Journal of Physical Activity and Health. He was awarded the new investigator award from the American College of Sports Medicine in 2007 and the Nutrition Society Silver Medal in 2013.
