

Selina Khoo Country contact Malaysia

Selina Khoo is an associate professor at the Sports Centre, University of Malaya, Kuala Lumpur. Her research interests are related to participation of sports and physical activity. She serves on national and international committees including the Asian Society for Adapted Physical Education and Exercise (ASAPE) and the Commonwealth Advisory Body on Sport (CABOS). Selina is also a National Course Director for the Olympic Council of Malaysia and facilitates Ólympic Solidarity Sport Administrators courses. She has published articles in national and international journals as well as books and book chapters. She has been invited to present her research at national and international conferences, including the International Forum on Children with Special Needs, IOC World Sport for All Congress, and Global Summit on the Physical Activity of Children. Her current research projects are related to participation in physical activity funded by High Impact Research grants from the University of Malaya and Ministry of Education.



Altyn Aringazina Country contact Kazakhstan

Dr. Altyn Aringazina (DrMedSc, PhD) is Head of the Department of Population Health and Social Sciences at the Kazakhstan School of Public Health in Almaty since 1998. She was elected as a member of the WHO Expert Advisory Panel on Health Promotion for 2009-2013. In this capacity she has participated actively in a number of WHO activities in the European Region and globally. Dr. Aringazina has also worked productively as a globally elected member of the Board of Trustees of the International Union for Health Promotion and Education (IUHPE). She has led studies of health promotion capacity and public health infrastructure in Kazakhstan and has been an instrumental force in designing elements of the reform of the current public healthcare system.

As the principal author of several critical studies of health promotion capacity in Kazakhstan, Dr. Aringazina has emerged within Kazakhstan and Central Asia, as a leading scholar of health promotion and public health.

Dr. Aringazina conducted postdoctoral research in public health as a Fulbright Scholar at Columbia University in the City of New York. Her research focused on health promotion policy and public health capacity
